# Unicode request for Saudi riyal sign

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2025 February 24

This proposal is for the Saudi currency sign introduced in 2025, <ﷺ). The design is a ligature of the Arabic word مريال riyāl, with the letter r turned across the letters alif and l like the cross-bar in other currency symbols. It similar to the symbol for the Iranian currency, U+FDFC يول RIAL SIGN, which in some typefaces has a similar ligature, e.g. < إلى in Adobe Arabic and < إلى in Noto Naskh Arabic, but the Saudi character is intended for both RTL and LTR text whereas U+FDFC is specifically RTL. The Saudi symbol is officially placed to the left of a number and separated with a space (Figure 2).




Figure 1. Saudi Central Bank (2025). Design of the symbol.
